AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND IN PART AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "CITY OF HANCOCK ZONING ORDINANCE #309 WHICH WAS ADOPTED August 10, 2022, AS AMENDED.

THE MUNICIPALITY OF HANCOCK, HOUGHTON COUNTY, MICHIGAN ORDAINS:

 Section 3.15, entitled Zoning Map (the "Zoning Map") of The City of Hancock Zoning Ordinance of August, 2022, as amended (hereinafter the "Ordinance"), shall be amended to change the zoning for Parcel ID# 051-200-002-50 from R2 Multi-Family to Community Mixed Use, as generally depicted below. The property is commonly known as Wargelin Hall, Nikander Hall, and Mannerheim Hall. The street address for the property is 535 Franklin St., Hancock, MI 49930, and 601 Franklin St, Hancock, MI 49930 and 705 Franklin St., Hancock, MI 49930.



6. The definition of Personal Care & Beauty Services Category contained in Section 9 of the Ordinance shall be changed to include Public Saunas, as follows:

Current Definition:

Personal Care & Beauty Services. An establishment which accommodate two or more clients at one time providing nonmedical services, including, but not limited to, beauty salons, barber shops and tanning salons by licensed professionals, which may also include accessory retail sales of products related to the services provided.

New Definition:

Personal Care & Beauty Services. An establishment which accommodates two or more clients at one time providing nonmedical services, including, but no limited to, *public saunas*, beauty salons, barber shops, tanning salons by a licensed facility where required by law, which may also may include accessory retail sale of products related to the services provided.

7. Clerical error in Section 5.03.C.1 change from 15 ft setback to 5 ft setback between primary structure and accessory building.

8. Clerical error in Section 3.13 Dimensions Summary Table to insert Minimum Floor Area Per Unit (SQ. FT) One-family Residential District (R1) – 750 SF, Multi-family Residential District (R2) 1 BR 500SF, 2 BR 700 SF, 3 BR 900 SF, 4 BR 1100 SF
