# § 53.01 ADOPTION OF STATE WATER SUPPLY CROSS CONNECTION RULES.

The city adopts by reference the water supply cross connection rules of the Michigan Department of Public Health being R325.11401 to R325.11407 of the Michigan Administration Code; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties conditions and terms of the said water supply cross connection-rules of the Michigan Department of Public Health are hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this chapter.

#### § 53.02 INSPECTION OF POSSIBLE CROSS CONNECTIONS.

It shall be the duty of the City Manager to cause inspections to be made of all properties served by the public water supply where cross connections with the public water supply is deemed possible. The frequency of inspections and reinspections based on potential health hazards involved shall be as established by the City Manager and as approved by the Michigan Department of Public Health.

# § 53.03 RIGHT OF ENTRY FOR INSPECTION PURPOSES.

The representative of the city shall have the right to enter at any reasonable time any property served by a connection to the public water supply system of the city for the purpose of inspecting the piping system or systems thereof for cross connections. On request the owner, lessees or occupants of any property so served shall furnish to the inspection agency any pertinent information regarding the piping system or systems on such property. The refusal of such information or refusal of access, when requested, shall be deemed evidence of the presence of cross connections.

#### § 53:04 DISCONTINUANCE OF WATER SERVICE.

The city is hereby authorized and directed to discontinue water service after reasonable notice to any property wherein any connection in violation of this chapter exists, and to

take such other precautionary measures deemed necessary to eliminate any danger of contamination of the public water supply system. Water service to such property—shall not be restored until the cross connection(s) has been eliminated in compliance with the provisions of this chapter.

# § 53.05 LABELING OF WATER OUTLETS.

- (A) The potable water supply-made available on the properties served by the public water supply shall be protected from possible contamination as specified by this chapter and by the state and city plumbing code.
- (B) Any water outlet which could be used for potable or domestic purposes, and which is not supplied by the potable system must be labeled in a conspicuous manner as:

# § 53:06 SUPPLEMENTARY TO STATE CODES.

This chapter does not supersede the state plumbing code and plumbing ordinance but is supplementary to them.

#### § 53.07 DEVICE TESTING,

All testable backflow prevention—assemblies shall be tested at the time of installation or relocation and after any—repair.—Subsequent testing of devices shall be conducted (by owners of devices) every three years and in accordance with Michigan Department of Environmental Quality—requirements. Only individuals that hold a valid Michigan plumbing license and have successfully passed an approved backflow testing class shall perform such testing. Each tester shall also be approved by the City of Hancock. Individuals(s) performing assembly-testing shall certify the results of his/her testing.

# § 53.99 PENALTY.

Any person or customer found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this chapter, or any written order of the (name of inspection agency or name of water utility), in pursuance thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 for each violation. Each day upon which a violation of the provisions of this act shall occur shall be deemed a separate and additional violation for the purpose of this chapter.

# ORDINANCE 314 TO AMEND CHAPTER 53 CROSS CONNECTION OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES

An ordinance regulating cross connections with the public water supply system, i.e., a connection or arrangement of piping or appurtenances through which water of questionable quality, wastes or other contaminants can enter the public water supply system.

Be it ordained by the City of Hancock (City) State of Michigan:

That the City adopts by reference the water supply cross connection rules of the Michigan Department of Environmental, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) being R325.11401 to R325.11407 of the Michigan Administration Code

That it shall be the duty of the City Manager to cause inspections to be made of all properties served by the public water supply where cross connections with the public water supply is deemed possible. The frequency of inspections and reinspections based on potential health hazards involved shall be as established by the City Manager and as approved by EGLE.

That the representative of the city shall have the right to enter at any reasonable time any property served by a connection to the public water supply system of the city for the purpose of inspecting the piping system or systems thereof for cross connections. On request the owner, lessees or occupants of any property so served shall furnish to the inspection agency any pertinent information regarding the piping system or systems on such property. The refusal of such information or refusal of access, when requested, shall be deemed evidence of the presence of cross connections.

That the City of Hancock Water Department is hereby authorized and directed to discontinue water service after reasonable notice to any property wherein any connection in violation of this ordinance exists, and to take such other precautionary measures deemed necessary to eliminate any danger of contamination of the public water supply system. Water service to such property shall not be restored until the cross connection(s) has been eliminated in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

That all testable backflow prevention assemblies shall be tested at the time of installation or relocation and after any repair. Subsequent testing of devices shall be conducted (by owners of devices) every three years and in accordance with EGLE requirements. Only individuals that hold a valid Michigan plumbing license and have current ASSE S110 Certification and each tester shall also be approved by the City. Individual(s) performing assembly testing shall certify the results of his/her testing.

That the potable water supply made available on the properties served by the public water supply shall be protected from possible contamination as specified by this ordinance and by the state and Houghton County plumbing code.

(A) Any water outlet which could be used for potable or domestic purposes and which is not supplied by the potable system must be labeled in a conspicuous manner as:

# WATER UNSAFE FOR DRINKING

This chapter does not supercede the state plumbing code and plumbing ordinance but is supplementary to it.

That all testable backflow prevention assemblies shall be tested at the time of installation or relocation and after any repair. Subsequent testing of devices shall be conducted (by owners of devices) every three years and in accordance with EGLE requirements. Only individuals that hold a valid Michigan plumbing license and have current ASSE S110 Certification and each tester shall also be approved by the City. Individual(s) performing assembly testing shall certify the results of his/her testing.

That any person or customer found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, or any written order of the City of Hancock Water Department, in pursuance thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 for each violation. Each day upon which a violation of the provisions of this act shall occur shall be deemed a separate and additional violation for the purpose of this chapter.

This ordinance was adopted and enacted by the City Council of the City of Hancock, Houghton County, Michigan on the 18th day of September 2024. Effective the 18th day of October 2024.
