- New Businesses in Town: Flywheel Fitness Studio at 787 Market Street, Small Town Goods (pop-up store open for the holidays) at 115 Quincy Street, Mazzoleni Art Studio at 116 Quincy Street (opens December 7), Mau L Seamstress and Alterations at 210 Quincy Street, and more to come!
- Wine Tasting: Hancock Rotary's Fundraiser "Deer Hunter's Wine Tasting and Silent Auction" is at the Finnish American Heritage Center on Friday, November 15<sup>th</sup> at 7 pm. Small plate food pairings will be catered by Gino's Restaurant.
